# **HMIS Committee Meeting**

February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2025 – 10:00am – 11:00pm Eastern Time

#### 1. Welcome and Introductions

• **Jim McShane** called the meeting to order at 10:01 am.

#### 2. Preliminary Point-in-Time Count Results

- **Eric Layton** presented the preliminary results of the unsheltered Point-in-Time count, noting that while the unsheltered count data is complete, the sheltered data is still being finalized due to pending results from non-HMIS participating agencies.
- The full results, including both sheltered and unsheltered counts, will be presented at the next CoC Membership and Board meeting in April.
- Eric highlighted trends in the data, including a slight overall increase in unsheltered homelessness and a potential rise in the count once recently incarcerated individuals (who meet HUD's definition of homelessness) are factored in.
- He also acknowledged positive trends, such as a decrease in the chronic homeless count and a continued reduction in unsheltered veteran homelessness, attributing these improvements to strong Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) and veteran-specific programs.

## 3. Data Quality and HMIS Reminders

- **Eric** emphasized the importance of accurately entering the client location CoC code, as recent audits revealed that 23% of entries contained errors. He reminded everyone that the correct CoC code for their region is FL-506.
- Common errors include selecting AL-506 instead of FL-506, which could impact funding allocations.

 He encouraged HMIS users to thoroughly review entries before submission to ensure accuracy.

## 4. Data Privacy and Security

- **Eric** reminded agencies of the importance of data security, warning that some case managers have been allowing clients to use their work computers, which is a violation of HMIS security protocols.
- He urged agencies to report any known security concerns and emphasized the need for proper safeguards to protect client data.
